Language Through Colour is a visual language strategy that helps students understand and build sentences by using colour-coding.

Word classes are given their own colour to help students:

- Understand sentence structure
- Organise their thoughts before speaking or writing
- Learn grammar and word functions
- Improve both comprehension and expressive language
- Understand questions and how to answer them appropriately
- Encourages children to check and improve their own work

Example: What toy is this?

Example: Where are they
going? - Home

Type of information: Time
Colour: Brown
Example: When are we
going to the park? - On
Saturday




Main Question:

Example: What does the
car look like? - Red and
shiny

Example: Why are they
happy? - Because they
won a prize

long?

Duration of action
Colour: Grey
Example: How long is the
journey? - 4 hours
