Message from the Headteacher



SANDWICH CLASS



'Sandwich class have settled back well after half term and welcomed a new student into their class. This term we have celebrated lots of world events such as Remembrance Day, World Kindness Day, World Science Day, Children in Need, Hanukkah, Christmas Jumper Day and Christmas.

Our English focus this term, has been based around the book of 'The Picture of Dorian Gray' by Oscar Wilde. During our English lessons the students were able to analyse the theme, characters, and relationships between the characters. By doing this they could explore the impact Victorian society had on the writing of the novel, which encouraged lots of class discussion.

For Maths this term we revisited mean, median, mode and range before moving on to Statistics. We focused on data collection, with the pupils conducting their own research around the school to be able to create a bar chart using the data collected. We then moved onto Algebra and worked hard to understand and simplify expressions to solve one and two step equations.

We have put up a new display in class featuring our Geography work from the term. The focus was to research London and it's population by identifying human and physical landscapes, as well as London's transportation network and settlement. Pupils were then able to sketch a map of London's famous landmarks and annotate a photo based on these landmarks.

In Science this term we focused on Space, motion and pressure with the pupils participating in an egg experiment to show gravity as a force. Whilst in PSHE we focused on radicalisation, extremism, Sharia-law, and cults. We looked at prevent duty to understand what can be done to prevent radicalisation and researched information on CULT leaders.

With the lead up to Christmas, students have experienced some exciting opportunities such as bowling for PE, going to the cinema, and celebrating the end of term with a Christmas party! We also had our first horse-riding session in the last week of term which was a huge success.

We look forward to welcoming Sandwich class back in January and continuing our UNO championships as well engaging with more learning opportunities across the curriculum. We hope you all have a lovely Christmas and a happy new year.
